## **Impact of spending**

For children:

- Opportunity to access large sports facilities and play competitive games at the local leisure centre
- Participation in a wider variety of sports e.g. kabaddi, dodgeball, continuation of fencing club, tri-golf
- Increased participation in and success in competitive sporting opportunities through participation in Cotswold Small Schools Sports Network with a structured competition calendar
- 1<sup>st</sup> place in cluster schools tournament, 2<sup>nd</sup> place in county final for netball
- Participation by children in Years 3 & 4 in competitive tournament
- Opportunity for children to compete against similar sized schools, providing a fairer competition
- 55% of children participating in at least 1 additional hour of sport per week

For teachers:

- Improved subject knowledge
- Professional development of sports leader in effective use of Sports funding
- Better understanding of providing challenge for children in sport
- Greater understanding of how to teach the skills required in different sports
