



# Our Golden Keys to Improvement



<b>STAFFING</b>	Our highest priority will be in training and developing our teachers and leaders. This will lead to stable staffing as the school's capacity grows. We will embed challenging teaching which will be a major factor in our children's rapid learning of new skills. We will invest in the training and development of support staff to ensure our children receive the highest quality of support inside and outside of the classroom and so teachers feel well supported to deliver learning that engages and challenges all children to make progress.
<b>PHONICS</b>	We will strive for high quality teaching of Little Wandle phonics. Our priority will be rigorous, high quality teaching of reading in KS1 bridging phonics and comprehension, with a focus on comprehension and fluency through our CUSP reading curriculum. We will raise the importance and significance of reading for pleasure across all year groups. Our lowest 20% of readers across the school will be able to read fluently before leaving Rangeworthy CoE Primary School.
<b>SEND</b>	Our children with SEND will be successful within the classroom and the school environment due to the effectiveness of provision meeting the identified needs of our children. Children with SEND will make progress in line with their peers. Every child with SEND will have a personalised "My Learning Plan" and they will be supported with following and understanding the behaviour policy and where necessary, personalised plans will be created. EHCPs will be written and supported through liaising with families and external agencies where appropriate.
<b>MATHS</b>	Our teaching of maths in Rangeworthy CoE Primary School will prioritise the arithmetic fluency using Mastering Number and Step Counting from EYFS to the end of KS2. Our planning of maths will include adaptive teaching and learning strategies for all learners. Our maths lessons will be consistent, progressive and challenging throughout the school. Our children will be able to identify and explore mathematical problems and patterns, transferring their learning into everyday life situations. Our children will feel confident in using a range of strategies and be able to articulate their reasoning and address any misconceptions.
<b>CHRISTIAN ETHOS</b>	We will celebrate and grow further our Christian ethos, ensuring the flourishing and well-being of all adults and children in all aspects of school life. We will ensure our school environment, including our classrooms, reflects our Christian ethos effectively. We will continue to develop a new programme of worship to develop further engagement and growth in our children's own spirituality. We will embed our school Christian values of 'Respect', 'Responsibility' and 'Friendship' throughout school life. We will regularly evaluate the impact of our Christian ethos across the school and ensure that our guiding mission of 'Let Your Light Shine' is the journey to our children's success.
